



How have we gotten here?

Finn Hill annexed to the City of Kirkland in June of 2011 which has neighborhood plans as part of the comprehensive plan.

The Denny Creek Neighborhood Alliance (DCNA) became the FHNA and made neighborhood planning a top priority.

In response to a private development rezoning request in 2012, FHNA leaders began discussing the need for a neighborhood plan with city leaders.

The City of Kirkland launched Vision 2035 in 2013 and began the process of updating the comprehensive plan.

In response to city concerns about resource and funding challenges to develop a neighborhood plan, FHNA contacts the Green Future's Lab.

In December, the city council approved neighborhood plan funding. FHNA commits \$5,000 to the project.
